- Actively involved with an organization that addresses a social or environmental problem.
- Actively involved with an organization that address the concerns of a specific community.
- Communicating with campus or community leaders about a pressing concern.
- Taking action in the community to try to address a social or environmental problem.
- Working with others to make the campus or community a better place.
- Acting to raise awareness about a campus, community, or global problem.
- Taking part in a protest, rally, march, or demonstration.
- Working with others to address social inequality.

Political and Social Activism

- Campus activists are individuals who are developing to understand the "injustices of the world, the tentativeness of authority, and striving to individualize their moral judgement" (Hunter, 1988).
- Student activism is associated with student involvement, encouraging the development of a number of important skills including critical thinking, interpersonal skills, public speaking, increased contact with faculty members, administrators, and state representatives.
- Students best learn when they are passionate about what they are learning and engaged in constructing their knowledge rather than only receiving it.
- Learning increases as the student becomes more invested in their subject. Passion regarding their subject means the quality of involvement will be greater.

Freedom Expression

Getting involved is important and allowing one to express his, her, or their opinion on a certain issue matters. TCNJ encourages those to get involved should they wish to do so! One can get involved by addressing matters that are important to them; inviting a speaker, holding a panel, or utilizing a public area for an event are just some of the ways an individual may get involved!

- Students and student organizations are free to examine and to discuss all questions of interest to them, and to express opinions publicly and privately.
