COVID-19 required a deeper dive into the financials and services provided by five of our existing service and revenue contractors/contracts: Sodexo, Culinary Vending Services snack vending, Pepsi, CSI MicroFridge, and Caleco laundry services. This included negotiating our Dining Services Contract through 2036.

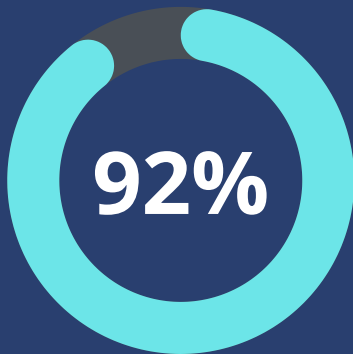
